



DAMAR SPECIALIZED AUTISM SERVICES

At Indiana NeuroDiagnostic Institute and Advanced Treatment Center

The state-of-the-art autism unit at the Indiana NeuroDiagnostic Institute and Advanced Treatment Center is operated by Damar Services in partnership with the IU School of Medicine, Department of Psychiatry.

Purpose

Clients receive in-patient services for approximately six weeks with the goal of behavioral stabilization followed by successful transition with their families or caregivers and their community.

- Establish a clear diagnosis
- Create a unique treatment plan for each family
- Training caregivers
- Work with community to ensure success after discharge

Criteria for Admission

- Adolescents with autism, 12 to 18 years
- Resident of Indiana
- Needs immediate stabilization of behavioral issues
- Behaviors have not been effectively managed in the home, community or school

Referrals can come from community mental health centers, Indiana Department of Child Services, schools and families. Parents, guardians or caregivers will be heavily involved in the treatment process. Post discharge training and support is included in the service.

About the NDI

The Indiana NeuroDiagnostic Institute and Advanced Treatment Center, or NDI, is the state's first new psychiatric hospital in more than 50 years. The 159-bed facility built on the campus of Community East Hospital will serve a range of acute and chronic mental health conditions, developmental disabilities, traumatic brain injury and degenerative illnesses.
